away from "home".

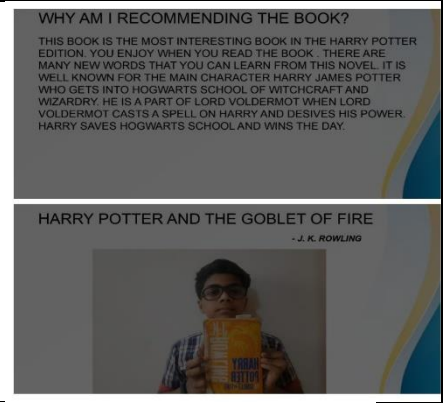
